## Trees & Shrubs for Fall Interest

Various factors contribute to the color that your tree leaves develop in the fall. The most important factor is selecting trees and shrubs that produce specific colors. Adequate moisture is also a factor; most shrubs and trees generally require 1" of moisture per week. The vividness of the color will then be influenced by the weather. For peak color to develop, leaves require warm, sunny days and cool, frosty nights.

## Trees & Shrubs by Color

- F = Full Sun: Full sun locations allow plants to cast their own shadow for 6 or more hours a day.
- L = Light Shade: Light shade locations give plants 4–6 hours of sun and will usually tolerate full sun.
- H = Heavy Shade: Heavy shade locations receive little or no sun and will usually tolerate light shade.
